- Psychological thrillers such as drama, action, mystery and paranoia.

These atmospheres not only stir up our emotions, but they release endorphins similar to getting high. Believe it or not, the hormones that are released during a scary moment are actually hormones that make us feel good. Those situations revolve around our emotions, and after we release, we feel better.

I have another theory, and this theory is supported by someone who knows human beings better than we know ourselves... and his name if God.

The LORD has made everything for his own purposes,
even the wicked for a day of disaster.

Romans 3:23 (NLT)
For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard.

Romans 6:23 (NLT)
For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord.

Now that's some scary news that makes any horror film or haunted house look like a walk in the park. If you're thinking... "Rick, you can't be serious, sin and eternal hell. Come on man, give me a break." Well my friend, not only is it true, but no matter how good we attempt to be, remember this... sins cannot be erased by good works.

Isaiah 64:6 (NLT)

We are all infected and impure with sin. When we display our righteous deeds, they are nothing but filthy rags. Like autumn leaves, we wither and fall, and our sins sweep us away like the wind.



Now that's scary bad news and I realize you may be tempted to stop watching. Well don't be, because none of this horrific information has anything to do with those who receive the gift of God. This gift came into the world and his name was Jesus. Remember the second most popular holiday... Christmas. That's when we celebrate his birth because he came for one distinct purpose. He came to die on a cross because God's holy standard required a perfect sacrifice. And only Jesus, God in the flesh, could meet that standard. Listen to these words from the Bible – God's holy word.

John 3:16 (NLT)

"For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life."

Romans 5:8 (NLT)
But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ
to die for us while we were still sinners.

Think about those words. God demonstrated his love for us that while we were sinners Christ died for us. He didn't ask us to get religious, give up our sins or try to be better.
