## Ephesians 4:26-30 (NLT)

And don't sin by letting anger control you. Don't let the sun go down while you are still angry, for anger gives a foothold to the devil. If you are a thief, quit stealing. Instead use your hands for good hard work, and then give generously to others in need. Don't use foul or abusive language. Let everything you say be good and helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear them. And do not bring sorrow to God's Holy Spirit by the way you live. Remember he has identified you as his own, guaranteeing that you will be saved on the day of redemption. Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger, harsh words, and slander, as well as all types of evil behavior. Instead be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you.



• The Bomb | Example: Cain

#### Genesis 4:5, 8 (NLT)

The <u>Buttoned-Up</u> | Example: Jeremiah

#### Jeremiah 15:17-18 (GNT)

"I did not spend my time with other people, laughing and having a good time. In obedience to your orders I stayed by myself and was filled with anger. Why do I keep on suffering? Why are my wounds incurable? Why won't they heal? Do you intend to disappoint me like a stream that goes dry in the summer?"

• The Big Baby | Example: The Prodigal's Brother

#### **Luke 15:28-30** (MSG)

"The older brother stomped off in an angry sulk and refused to join in. His father came out and tried to talk to him, but he wouldn't listen. The son said, 'Look how many years I've stayed here serving you, never giving you one moment of grief, but have you ever thrown a party for me and my friends? Then this son of yours who has thrown away your money on whores shows up and you go all out with a feast!"

## **Control** my emotions and think before reacting.

#### Proverbs 13:16 (GNBDC)

Sensible people always think before they act, but stupid people advertise their ignorance.

## Proverbs 29:11 (GNBDC)

Stupid people express their anger openly, but sensible people are patient and hold it back.

## Three Questions to Ask Myself:

- Why I am really angry?
- What do I really want out of this tense moment?
- How can I really glorify God in this situation?

## Proverbs 15:1 (TPT)

Respond gently when you are confronted and you'll defuse the rage of another. Responding with sharp, cutting words will only make it worse. Don't you know that being angry can ruin the testimony of even the wisest of men?

## The Three Causes of Anger:

- <u>Hurt</u> When somebody is pushing your buttons and they're angry, it may be their hurt.
- <u>Frustration</u> When you get frustrated, you get angry. When you're irritated, when you're forced to wait, you get angry.
- Fear When you are afraid or feel threatened, you fight back.



#### **Psalm 141:3** (NCV)
